We have our own herb garden, we use a steam cleaning process where possible and have a bee-friendly flower garden. By implementing as many sustainable practices as possible we hope to ensure the continual enjoyment of the Cairngorms National Park for generations to come. Where possible we attempt to:

- Encourage guests to use local shops, cafés and restaurants
- Encourage birds, bees and multicultural flora in the garden and provide information for guests
- Continually look at ways to improve our commitment to green issues
